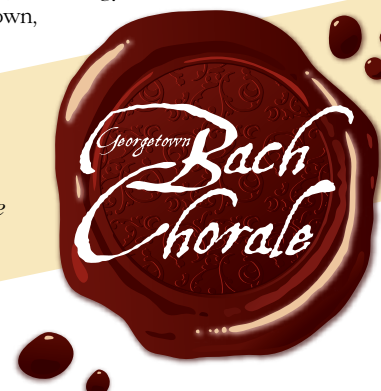

## Mozart's Requiem Mass in D minor

About four years ago, Georgetown had the opportunity to hear the Chorale offer a riveting rendition of Mozart's incredible Mass for the dead. As lugubrious as that may sound, this work is hardly dark. It is a masterpiece filled with dramatic choruses, lyrical solos, and quartets. In addition to this Requiem that would probably waken the dead, pianist and artistic director Ron Greidanus will perform Mozart's Piano Concerto #22 in E flat Major. This work and the Requiem were both used as part of the dramatic soundtrack from Hollywood's depiction of Mozart's life in the film *Amadeus*.
